

College Township Cemetery is located at Quarry Chapel and the intersection of Quarry Chapel Road and Monroe Mills Road, Gambier, Ohio, 43022.

Quarry Chapel was dedicated in January 1863. The earliest confirmed grave site is Joseph Dale, who died from a fall from a tree at age11 in1872. However, there are three gravesites from the 1860's in the left rear of the cemetery, one a 16 year old girl. Her mother may be buried nearby.

There are two graves of veterans of the Civil War.

The College Township cemetery is active but Quarry Chapel no longer serves a religious purpose, it is a public venue available for weddings, funeral, memorial services, etc.

The Friends of the Quarry Chapel is responsible for the enhancement and maintenance of the Chapel.

### (A) Joseph Dale 1872

When Joseph Dale was born in 1861in England, his father, Lewis, was 32 and his mother, Eliza, was 30. The family arrived in the US in 1868. He had three brothers. He died as a child of age 11 on February 16, 1872, in Gambier, Ohio, and was buried there. His death was the result of falling from a tree on the family farm. His obit was in the 1872 February edition of the Democratic Banner.

#### (B) Private Corporal John West 1874

His will was read 4 days after death on April 6, 1874; he only mentioned a friend named Peter Parker, and was a resident of College Twp.

William Estabrook was born in 1807 in Okehampton, Devon, England to Thomas Eastabrook (1777- ) and Sarah Westlake ( - ).

He married Mary Jordan (1805-1891) in Okehampton, Devon, England

They arrived in the USA in 1857 or 1958 with seven children all born in England. George was 55 years old at the time the chapel was constructed.

Emanuel S. Daneman, 97, 107 Wiggen Street, Gambier, died Saturday afternoon at his home.

Born Sept. 8, 1884 in Germantown, to the late Aron and Ella (Sternberger) Daneman, he was a former resident of Cincinnati and had lived in Gambier for the past three years.

Mr. Daneman was a deacon of the Walnut Hills Christian School, Cincinnati.

He was a 59 year member of the Avon Lodge **No.** 542 F.&A.M., a 49 year member of the Scottish Rite, and a 49 year member of the Syrian Temple Shrine, all of Cincinati.

Mr. Daneman was also a 30 year member of the Cincinnati Club.

Surviving are two sons, Dr. E. Adams Daneman of Gambier, with whom he made his home, and Joseph Aaron Daneman of Houston, Texas; 10 grand-children; and several great-grandchildren.

Dr. E. Adams Daneman, 59, longtime Gambier resident, died Thursday due to complications of injuries sustained when his car caught on fire on C.H. 33 Aug. 23. He was taken to University Hospital in Columbus, where his condition initially was described as critical.

Dr. Daneman was founder of Daneman Laboratories which is now the premier electroencephalograph (EEG) and echoencephalograph (ECHO) service in the United States with more than 100 client hospitals. A nationally honored neurologist and psychotherapist, Dr. Daneman was also a scientist and inventor.

He was born Oct. 11, 1924 in Cincinnati to Emanuel S. and Lillian (Adams) Daneman. As a Kenyon College junior he displayed such intelectual promise that he was directly admitted to the University of Cincinnati School of Medicine. There he read Freud in the original German and took advanced courses in psychoanalysis. At age 22, he earned an M.D.

After completing his residency at Louisville General Hospital, Dr. Daneman was invited to join the staff of Worcester State Hospital (Mass.), an institution in the vanguard of American psychiatry and psychoanalysis for more than 100 years. At Worcester, Daneman was to become the preminent EEG interpreter.

While still in his 20s he authored research, introducing new insights on arteriosclerosis, that was presented pefore the Third Inernational Congress in Geroutology, London, England.

It was in 1956 that Daneman went into private practice nationwide EEG and ECHO analysis. Originally, communication by the doctor and client hospitals was by mail. But in 1971 Daneman co-invented portable equipment that perfected two-way telephone transmission.

In recent years, Dr. Daneman continued his renowned nationwide practice in EEG and ECHO from his laboratories in Mount Vernon.

Dr. Daneman is survived by his wife, Gail (Peters) of Gambier; six children, Eve, Madelyn, Sarah, Stuart, Susan Daneman Richardson, and Mary; and a brother, Joseph Aaron Daneman.

He was preceded in death by his mother in 1941 and his father in 1981.

There will be no calling hours. Graveside service will be 3 p.m. Sunday at Quarry Chapel Cemetery, Gambier. The Rev. Lincoln Stelk will officiate. The Dowds-Wiggins Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

The family has asked denotions be made to the Kenyon Review of Kenyon College or Rutherford B. Hayes Memorial Library.

He was a doctor, married several times, 3 daughters and 1 son, made many gifts to Kenyon (money and science etc.), had a lab in Mt Vernon, went to the U. of Cincinnati and transferred to Kenyon; lived in what is now Gambier House B & B.

She married a Mr. Keane.

She served in the Navy as Agnes Keane from 9 May 1944 to 01 June 1946.

She died at age 76 on 3 January 1994 at a nursing home in Mount Vernon, Knox, Ohio.
